LYKIA – HIDDEN CORNERS

'Hidden' can mean - remote and difficult to visit; accessible but rarely visited; there to see but most will pass by; or clearly visible but misunderstood. We explore all these meanings in our talk, which is based on visiting and researching SW Turkey for more than a decade.

Based in Kaş, we explore this mountainous and largely inaccessible region; the range of designs of the characteristic tomb architecture; the coastal villages of Simena and Üçağız; the ancient cities of Arykanda and Limyra; the agriculture and industry in Kasaba; the domestic architecture of ambar granaries and mud-brick houses; ending in the remote Girdev basin.

Part 2 starts with the often visited Saklıkent Gorge and nearby Carpet School, continuing to the beach fronting the major ruins at Patara and Letoon; the little known oracle of Apollo at Sura; and the port at Andriake. Options on where to stay conclude with a visit to the world unique Chimaera flames at Çıralı.
