Clauses - An Introduction

Sentences frequently have subordinate clauses. In English these are recognised by the use of such conjunctions as *who, which, that, when* and the clause follows what is being qualified. Sometimes the conjunction is omitted/implied. Where a clause qualifies a noun, the clause can be thought of as an adjective.

In English, who in a clause is different from the question who?. In Turkish kim?

Turkish uses either verb suffixes, verbal adjectives or verb participles for clauses, and the clause comes before what is being qualified.

In both English and Turkisk an adjective comes before a noun, so the Turkish order for an adjectival clause is actually the same.
